Our working definition of FOCUSED PRAYER: As we pray in the spirit, we work to keep our conscious mind on the topic at hand. We have specific questions, scriptures, and instructions that we keep at the forefront of our thinking. We remove every personal agenda from our thinking, replacing fears, doubt, distractions, and personal opinions with the words God has caused to be placed before us.

This is our opportunity to be unified in the spirit by the bond of peace (see Ephesians 4), as the Lord teaches us to look at His promises to us from His perspective. We are all in this

## **Our specific questions for Holy Spirit:**

I.What type of property do You have in mind for us now? II.What is the function of this first property/building? III.Is it single or multi-story?

## **Instructions for our prayer times:**

1. We begin with repentance, ensuring that our hearts are clear of any hindrances to hearing His voice.

**Prayer Guideline:** Lord, we come as a body of Your astounding love, focusing on preparing our hearts and attitudes through humbling ourselves and repentance before You, so that we can clearly hear You speak to us as one. We submit our hearts before You, seeking forgiveness for every wrong committed against You, ourselves, and others. We want to ensure that our hearts are clear of any hindrances that would cause us to miss hearing Your voice. We repent of being offended, bitter, or judgmental. We repent for causing offence, bitterness, or judgments in the hearts of others. And in the Name of Jesus Christ, we forgive and release those that have sinned against us.

- 2. Next, we spend 5 10 minutes praying in tongues corporately. We are giving Him praise for the answers to our questions. We keep our minds focused on thanking the Lord for hearing us. After we have done this, we're ready for our next step.
- 3. **The call or prayer team leader asks Holy Spirit the first question**, again thanking Him that He will reveal answers to us as we pray.
  - a. Then we spend another 5-10 minutes praying in tongues., keeping our minds focused on the question that we have asked.
  - b. Write down what you get in answer to the specific question.

- c. Share it with the group, one at a time. Even if we don't have anything personally to share, we rejoice with what the Lord is saying through the rest of the team.
- d. Spend a few minutes thanking Holy Spirit for the answers received. We are gathering all the pieces to the picture He is painting.
- 4. Move on to the next two questions, repeating the same pattern.
- 5. After all the questions have been asked and prayed over, before ending the call or gathering, let's take a few moments to worship the Lord and thank Him for the work He is doing in us.

## What We Do After the Group Prayer

Per Dr. Baker's instructions, we each take it upon ourselves to go back to Holy Spirit with the answers we've received. We are pursuing intimacy with Holy Spirit, not just asking Him for information. Follow the same pattern. Let's ask Him to confirm what He's shown or told you by directing us to scriptures in the Word of God. He won't mind a bit. Then pray in the Spirit.

Again, we each write down what He gives us in our intimate time with Him. This is so exciting! We are on track to have the most amazing experience with God we have ever had as a corporate body. This is so cool!



## Our "As One" Scriptures for Agreement

Please read the following portions of scripture, meditating upon, and praying them. We are asking the Lord to make these scriptures and promises a normal part of our thinking, speaking, and actions as we pray. Remember, faith comes by hearing, so let's make sure we read them aloud, or to one another. (3)

Now I plead with you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment. 1 Corinthians 1:10 NKJV
